5. Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) Plan-Resolution 2025-003

Troy Ebbert represented the Resolution on behalf of CDM Smith and explained that this resolution is for the adoption of the updated Regional ITS Architecture and Deployment Plan. Once the resolution is approved the plan will be posted for public comment and FHWA approval.

6. Update on Long-Range Transportation Plan

Timothy Tresohlavy with Stantec reviewed the timeline and explained that we are close to the finish line and hopefully have everything adopted around May or a little later.

7. Discussion on proposed TIP amendment between Morristown and Jefferson City.

Andrew Eller, Morristown City Administrator, address the board and explained the cost increase on the proposed TIP project and the request for the TIP amendment. He advised that he get will with James Gallup to review the proposed funding and send the information to staff. Troy Ebbert explained that once the numbers have been agreed upon, LAMTPO can hold a special called meeting for the TIP amendment and the adoption of the PM2 & PM3 resolutions. The board agreed to support the amendment. No vote was taken.

8. Information/Updates from FHWA/FTA/TDOT

The SPP Program is delayed due to the disaster recovery in NE TN. TDOT has requested over \$500M in reimbursement from Congress, and they are waiting on that decision so they can prepare the SPP to present to the state legislature later this spring.

SR34/US 11E on the east end of Morristown has been awarded to Summers Taylor, TDOT expected to begin construction this month, but this has been delayed due to the hurricane disaster recovery trying to replace several lost assets during the disaster. There will be a pre-construction meeting in late January and another meeting with the schools and local governments to discuss expectations and traffic control.

Snyder Road and SR9 in Jefferson County has been reviewed for improvements, this will become a 4 way stop as the result of multiple crashes. This will be implemented once there is a break in the weather.

Michelle Christian has taken a new position with TDOT and is no longer the representative for the Lakeway MPO, Troy will be assuming all responsibilities for the time being.

WHEREAS, the Lakeway Area Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization (LAMTPO) is the organization responsible for planning and efficient transportation system in the Lakeway Region and for the appropriate use of federal transportation funds in that area; and
WHEREAS, in 2012 Congress passed the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21) and Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act that mandate the establishment of a performance and outcome-based program for transportation decisions; and continues under the Infrastructure Improvement and Jobs Act (IIJA); and
WHEREAS, MPOs have 180 days following the establishment and reporting of the State targets in the HSIP Annual Report to decide regarding whether to support each state's targets or to establish their own; and
WHEREAS, the LAMTPO Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) approved and supports the Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) 2022-2025 Performance Measure Targets for PM2 and PM3 at their meeting on February 12, 2025.
WHEREAS, the LAMTPO Executive Board approves and supports the Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) PM2 & PM3 Performance Measures; and

Verification of 2022-2025 Transportation Performance Measures Target Adjustments

This Verification Form confirms the 2022-2025 PM2 and PM3 Pavement, Bridge, and System Performance target adjustments the Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) submitted in the 2024 Mid Performance Period Progress Report to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) on October 16, 2024. Official reporting of all target adjustments listed in this document occurred through FHWA's Performance Management Form (PMF). Target adjustments have been reviewed and approved by TDOT executive leaders and members of the Final Rule Implementation Oversight Committee.

MPO target decisions must be made within 180 days after State targets have been adjusted (no later than April 14, 2025). This decision shall be adopted through an approved resolution and forwarded to TDOT's Office of Community Transportation and Strategic Planning, Research & Innovation Division. For further clarification, please see the federal rule excerpt below.

- (7) MPO response to State DOT target adjustment. For the established targets in paragraph (f)(3) of this section, if the State DOT adjusts a 4-year target in the State DOT's Mid Performance Period Progress Report and if, for that respective target, the MPO established a target by supporting the State DOT target as allowed under paragraph (f)(3)(i) of this section, then the MPO shall, within 180 days, report to the State DOT whether it will either:
 - (i) Agree to plan a program of projects so that they contribute to the adjusted State DOT target for that performance measure; or
 - (ii) Commit to a new quantifiable target for that performance measure for its metropolitan planning area.
- (8) Target adjustment. If the MPO establishes its target by committing to a quantifiable target, described in paragraph (f)(3)(ii) of this section or establishes target(s) for the Total Emissions Reduction measure required in paragraph (f)(6)(iii) of this section, then the MPOs may adjust its target(s) in a manner that is collectively developed, documented, and mutually agreed upon by the State DOT and MPO. Any adjustments made to 4-year targets, established for CMAQ Traffic Congestion measures in paragraph (f)(5)(i) or (ii) of this section, shall be collectively developed and agreed upon by all State DOTs and MPOs that include any portion of the NHS in the respective urbanized area applicable to the measure.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Federal Requirements of the US Department of Transportation, the elements of the transportation planning process are to receive final approval from the Executive Board of the local Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization, and

WHEREAS, the 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) was approved by the Executive Board and the FFY 2023-2026 TIP was approved on November 9, 2022.

WHEREAS, the Morristown City and Jefferson City Managers have agreed to the change based on construction timelines for each project.

WHEREAS, the FFY 2023-2026 TIP has been prepared by the local planning staff and the Technical Advisory Committee subcommittee, with an endorsement from the LAMTPO Technical Advisory Committee; and

WHEREAS, The governing bodies of the LAMTPO wishes to enhance the transportation and safety in the region; and

WHEREAS, this TIP amendment is to move STBG funding from the Jefferson City Project #3016-Old Andrew Johnson Hwy, 1008 E. Andrew Johnson Hwy. resurfacing, to the Morristown City Project #1003-E. Morris Blvd. due to construction cost increase.

WHEREAS, there has been a public comment period allowed for the proposed amendment, and no comments were made, and the FFY 2023-2026 TIP will remain financially constrained, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED; the Lakeway Area Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization (LAMTPO) Executive Board hereby approves the amendment to the FFY 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program.
